The theme of the February 8, 2022 meeting of the Grand Canyon Photography Club is "Members Helping Members." The informal lessons will begin at 7 p.m. after a short business meeting. Meetings are held at the Gmeiner Art & Cultural Center in Wellsboro, PA.

"The purpose of this program is two-fold," said President Paul Bozzo. "We want to help members better understand their cameras, whether DSLRs or smart phones and also to hopefully attract new members with the offer of free photography help and advice."

The group will be divided into "experts" of certain types and makes of cameras and "novices" who would like to learn more about their cameras. The more experienced photographers will talk about and answer questions from those with less experience.

Paul will also demonstrate 2 methods for labeling images for critique, something that many members still struggle with.

Gary Thompson will lead the critique on the topic: If you change the way you look at things, the things you look at will change. Members were asked to submit 2 images of the same subject, changing the way they photographed the image from one photo to another. (e.g. changing the angle, height, or distance)

Members are encouraged to bring guests and the general public is invited to attend. Feel free to bring your cameras and your questions. The Gmeiner encourages wearing a mask for all programs.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

COMPOSITION

"There are no rules for good photographs, only good photographs." —Ansel Adams

Of course, there are many guidelines for making good photographs. But that is all they are – guidelines. I think that hard work, observation, thought, experiment, and practice will serve you better in the long run than a list of "rules" or generalities. That being said, it's not a bad idea to keep these ideas in your head while shooting: LEADING LINES, THE THREE ZONES – FOREGROUND, MIDDLE GROUND, and BACKGROUND, DIAGONALS, "S" CURVES, VISUAL WEIGHT/MASS, THE BRIGHTEST AREAS WILL DRAW THE

EYE, EDGE PATROL, RULE OF THIRDS, RULE OF ODDS, FRAMING. If you don't understand one or two of these concepts ask someone at a meeting!

Here are a few words about practice. Maybe you should try taking many shots of something that interests you -BUT SWITCH THEM UP. As we heard in a video (Mike Browne-How to See Photos and Compositions: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=L16LEcTGGdQ&t=4s)at the January meeting, "If you change the way you look at things, the things you look at change." —Albert Einstein

For example, the image of this small creek could be shot from either side, from above the cascade, from near ground level, with the camera vertical, and, if you can climb, get up a tree to shoot down on it. Then when you get home, you will have many images to study and compare. Decide what looks best to you. If you want to improve, you must work at it.

I know that many "experts" on YouTube say they do what "feels right." Good luck developing your sense of "feel."




