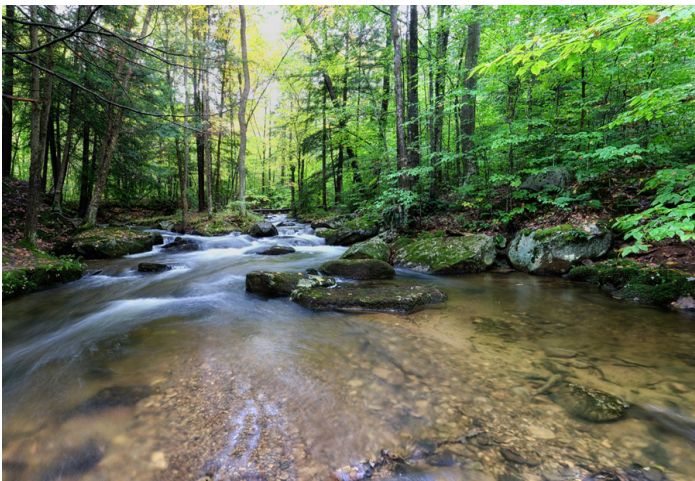


A Hiking We Will Go

The July 12, 2022 meeting of the Grand Canyon Photography Club will be a group hike up Asaph Run where the Baker Branch begins. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

SAFE HIKING

There are over 62,000 acres of public land in Tioga County. Many photographers have spent hours hiking and exploring these natural public areas. There are numerous waterfalls, gorges, hiking trails, logging roads, forests, and plants all around us. Many locals enjoy capturing the abundant wildlife, too. Here I will give you a glimpse into how I approach hiking safety.

First, it's good to have a sturdy underpinning. I wear tall boots with micro-spikes year-round. I feel somewhat protected from rattlesnakes. I don't worry about wet feet during creek crossings.



I have protection from slipping on snow, ice, and moss. For sure, wear sturdy hiking boots. Second, I carry a light-weight tripod that doubles as a walking stick. It's a good idea to

use it as a thumper, too. Hit on downed logs before stepping over to cause snakes move away. Be careful when up against a rock wall – snakes like to rest on any ledges – don't put your hand blindly on a ledge. Third, use 40% Deet insect spray to discourage ticks from jumping on board. Avoid hiking through waist-high bushes because they often hold ticks. Walk in the middle of trails to help avoid ticks. Fourth, bring water. It is easy to work up a sweat on longer hikes so be prepared to hydrate yourself. Fifth, I always wear long pants to help with the tick problem. Sixth, go with a hiking buddy. If you are like me and enjoy some solitude "out there," leave a detailed map at home that shows

where you will park your vehicle and shows the direction you will be hiking. Leave an estimated return time. While making a map, checkout the area on whatever map you are using as a reference.

Remember to enjoy the journey. Take time to look around. Sometimes a great image is waiting to be captured – just behind you!

Remember, our group hike will be Tuesday, July 12. We will meet in front of the Green Free Library at 5:15pm and leave shortly after. We will drive approximately 25 minutes to where the Baker Branch joins Asaph Run. We will be among many boulders and hopefully lots of water. Think rain.
