Intro to Editing

President Paul Bozzo will present "Basics of Photo Editing" at the May 9th meeting of the Grand Canyon Photography Club. The program will begin at 7 p.m. after a short business meeting at the Gmeiner Art & Cultural Center in Wellsboro, PA.

"I suspect that most of you have a love of photography because you have an 'eye' for composition – you

know how to take interesting photos," said Paul. "Photo editing might help move your images to another level. The image on the right demonstrates what some editing might do to improve a photograph. Please compare it with the original, out of the camera, image on the left."

Paul will demonstrate the use of two programs, the same two that are loaded on the club's laptop: Adobe Photoshop Elements which is a simplified version of Photoshop – and much less expensive and The Nik Collection, which works as an add-on to Elements and has many powerful editing tools.

He also plans to demonstrate a number of the functions of Elements such as adjusting a RAW image, sizing images, working with the horizon, erasing unwanted elements, cloning, and listing some of more complex functions.

Paul will demonstrate many of the functions found in The Nik Collection: detail extraction, darken/lighten the center, contrast color range, graduated neutral density, and a few others if time allows.

He will also provide a handout detailing the two programs and their cost.

I separate present-day photography into two distinct parts. First, there is the ability to frame scenes in a way that attracts viewers and pleases the photographer (yourself). When photographers excel at that, people might say they "have a good eye." [We have a special program coming the first week of June – besides the regular meeting on Tuesday, June 13. Professional photographer Art Becker will be presenting a program on "Training Your Eye." The details and meeting venue should be worked out before the Tuesday, May 9th meeting.]


My eye (and brain) like the right-hand image better. I like the contrast of the white sycamore overlapping the dark and complex smaller tree. With making this choice, I've finished the first half of my "photographic equation."

The second half of the "equation" involves the editing of an image. The many programs



available to edit photos are often referred to as the "digital darkroom." Another warning – it is easy to overdo editing! This image was a challenging one. I wanted to bring out the small, dark tree without destroying the ghost-like feeling of the sycamores. I did much fiddling with converting the image from RAW, tweaking with Adobe Photoshop Elements, and more adjusting using the Nik Suite.

I will be presenting basic editing at our Tuesday, May 9 meeting and demonstrate many of the techniques I used on this image.
